

Seeking the Next Generation of Physician Leaders in HIV Primary Care for Saskatchewan

The Saskatchewan Infectious Disease Care Network (SIDCN), in collaboration with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Health and the Public Health Agency of Canada, is offering scholarships to support 3 recipients from Saskatchewan to participate in the British Columbia Center for Excellence in HIV/AIDS (BC-CfE) physician preceptor program (<https://education.cfenet.ubc.ca/preceptorship/>).

Criteria

- Primary Care Physician practicing medicine in Saskatchewan **or** Recent Graduate of Family Medicine with the intention to practice in Saskatchewan.
- Strong interest and desire to provide primary care to people living with HIV.
- Open to mentoring fellow primary care physicians in providing HIV care as experience and confidence builds.

Physician Preceptorship Program Details

- Review BC-CfE online HIV learning modules (<https://education.cfenet.ubc.ca/courses/hiv-diagnosis-and-management>) prior to Vancouver training week.
- 5-day clinical placement at the BC-CfE in the Immunodeficiency Clinic (located at St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver) to occur November 05-09, 2018.
- 3 months online, case-based mentoring with BC & SK Infectious Disease Specialists following Vancouver training week.

Additional Information

- The current preceptorship program offered through the BC-CfE is being “adapted for Saskatchewan” and will serve to advance knowledge and build sustained capacity for effective Saskatchewan HIV program delivery.
- Successful candidates will need to complete BC licensing process as a learner (similar to doing an elective as a resident) as required in preparation for November 2018 admission.

Included in the Scholarship

- Registration fee
- All travel costs, including flight, food and accommodations
- Academic stipend to replace lost earnings from practice during the 5-day preceptorship at the BC-CfE

Candidates who express an interest in dedicating part of their future practice to HIV and HCV medicine in Saskatchewan will be favoured. Graduates will be invited to participate in further primary care capacity improvement activities supported by SIDCN, the SK Ministry of Health, and Public Health Agency of Canada.
